## ♦ Child Development

This course is designed for male and female students who are parents, potential parents, and siblings to younger brothers and sisters, baby sitters and future child caregivers. Background knowledge in human growth and development will be taught through field trips, speakers, videos, and classroom work. Students will learn about reproduction, pregnancy, prenatal care of the mother, labor, delivery and the child up to 2 years of age. Baby simulator will be required for learning enhancement. Areas stressed will be adult/child relationships, discipline, physical, social, mental and emotional development, and play and career exploration in child development.

#### ♦ Child Care Careers

Class Type: Elective
Grade Level: 11-12
Credit: 1
Pre-requisite: None
Extra Costs: \$8.00

This course is designed so that students get actual job experience working with children. Approximately 60 hours of class time will be spent working with children in day care centers, nursery schools, kindergartens, early elementary school grades or special education programs. This course includes the development of humans from conception through age six, successful employment skills, job attributes and career exploration. This course is for those students interested in early childhood education careers (elementary teachers, nannies, day care providers, special education personnel and parents). When the course requirements have been satisfactorily completed, students could be certified by the ND State Board of Career and Technical Educators, and Williston High School.

Microwave cooking, fruits, vegetables, dairy foods, eggs, meat cookery, plus the sampling of unfamiliar foods are a few of the topics covered. The wise use of time, energy and the food dollar will be emphasized. Food labs are held approximately once a week and yes, we eat what we prepare!
